The Eastern Surfing Association is the largest amateur surfing association in the United States. It was founded in 1967, by East Coast surfers to promote, preserve and protect the sport of surfing on the East Coast. Our family-oriented programs promote a healthy and active lifestyle. It is not uncommon to find two or three generations of the same family involved as members of the ESA, and actively competing in our program. Original ESA founders, Cecil Lear and David Reese, are still active in the Association today! The ESA's activities are organized into twenty-four districts, extending along nearly 2,000 miles of coastline. From the Great Lakes through the Florida Panhandle, each district's programs are developed and operated by a dedicated group of volunteer directors and staff. The ESA is a nonprofit 501 (c) (3) organization. The ESA is also an affiliate membership organization of USA Surfing.

Competition

One of the primary activities of the ESA is its program of competition for surfers of all ages and abilities. With a history of over fifty years of success, ESA contests are organized at the grassroots, district level on a year-round basis. Each district conducts four or more contests per year, and each year the ESA has over 150 competitions along the East Coast, Gulf Coast and the Great Lakes. Within these contests, surfers compete in ability groupings, ranging from novice to the most advanced competitors. The athletes are divided among a series of age groupings for both men and women, ranging from Menehunes (under twelve years of age), through Grand Legends (over age sixty). From the local District level, competitors may advance to Regional competitions, and possibly on to the Easterns® Surfing Championships. As an affiliated member organization of USA Surfing, ESA competitors may earn slots into the USA Surfing prime events and USA Surfing Championships.

Beach Access and Preservation

The ESA is the only effective organized voice on the East Coast, speaking politically and legally for the interests of East Coast surfers, working to ensure free public access to a clean beach and clean ocean environment. This effort becomes increasingly important as population swells cause greater competition for the limited areas of open beach still remaining.

The ESA has traditionally responded to efforts to limit surfing by political activities on a local level. When needed, the ESA's legal efforts are directed by a staff of attorneys who volunteer their service to the ESA pro bono.

Academic Scholarships

Deserving amateur surfers who wish to continue their formal education beyond the high school level can apply for financial assistance from the ESA's Marsh Scholarship Program. The grants are awarded annually to ESA members on the basis of academics and citizenship, rather than athletic ability. The program began in 1981 to recognize and honor the accomplishments of North Carolina surfer Mike Marsh. Mike set a fine example for students everywhere by earning his law degree while simultaneously and successfully waging his own private battle with cancer. To date, the ESA has awarded over \$200,000 in scholarships to deserving surfing scholars.

Ecology Education

In 1990, the ESA launched Surfers for Environmental Action (SEA) to serve as a clearing house for information regarding environmental concerns on the East Coast, and to develop a program of ecology education for our members. The ESA is currently affiliated with the Clean Water Network and the Environmental Defense Fund.
